Know the signs: Early identification can change lives

Autism is treatable. Children do not “outgrow” autism, but studies show that early diagnosis and intervention lead to significantly improved outcomes. For more information on developmental milestones, visit the CDC’s [“Know the Signs. Act Early”](https://www.cdc.gov/ncbddd/actearly/) site.

Here are some signs to look for in the children in your life:

- Repetitive use of language and/or motor mannerisms (e.g., hand-flapping, twirling objects)
- Lack of or delay in spoken language
- Little or no eye contact
- Lack of interest in peer relationships
- Lack of spontaneous or make-believe play
- Persistent fixation on parts of objects
